As you all know, GCEA is not one person driving this organization, it is a team effort that has brought us together for the 96th meeting of graphics educators! The opportunities to connect with other educators that understand the purpose of teaching graphic communications is relevant to the professional development of GCEA members. We each have our strengths and together we continue our education and fellowship at GCEA conferences so that we can share our new knowledge with our students.

We all had to start from somewhere! Our passion for print may have started with the smell of ink on the pages of newsprint or the touch of printed fabric. Something brought us together with a shared appreciation of the printed illustration that may include the rich beauty of typography or the dynamic images from a publication. Whether setting type by hand or using a photo typesetter, the printed word was brought to life. We are fortunate to have in the membership, highly talented experts in typography, webpage design, page layout design, cross media production, photography, and much more.

During my time on the faculty at Appalachian State University, the program name changed from Print Production Management to Graphic Arts and Imaging Technology in 1990, based on a recommendation from our industry advisory board. Then, the program name changed to Graphic Communications Management in 2019 as recommended by the Accrediting Council of Graphic Communications program reviewers.

The courses I am teaching now did not exist when I was a student. Presently, I teach seven courses involving premedia and cross media production. Courses such as Introduction and Advanced Web Development for Graphic Communications, Digital Media Composition 1 and 2, Intro and Advanced Cross Media Production, and Graphic Communications Seminar require a great deal of attention in preparing students with skill sets necessary for employment. These courses are based on needs assessments and gathering information from similar university graphic communication programs.

That is why GCEA is more important as I continue as a faculty member at Appalachian State University. GCEA is a great source for quality professional development gained from the conferences. Each of the conferences I have attended since 2002 have given me a set of practical experiences contributing to most of the courses I teach. Even so, there is still so much more to learn.

As a graphics educator, I cannot do it alone. Having access to a network of experienced educators that are highly skilled in areas that I teach, is the quality assurance necessary for a successful teaching career.
