2011 IGAEA Conference Update

This year's IGAEA Annual Conference will be at the Eldorado Hotel and Conference Center in "The Biggest Little"

City in the World", Reno, NV. Located near the California border and scenic Lake Tahoe, the site offers a wide variety of activities and opportunities prior and after the conference. The conference will start Sunday afternoon, July 24, and go until Thursday morning, July 28. The Conference Banquet will be Wednesday evening, July 27.

In a break from tradition brought on by a lack of a collegiate host, this year's Conference is being hosted by the IGAEA Board. Tom and Carol Loch, have volunteered to be the "host couple," and have worked along with the Board.

The Eldorado Hotel and Conference Center is located in central Reno. There is a complimentary shuttle service to and from the Reno/Tahoe International airport, which is just three miles away. The Reno Amtrak station is less than three blocks away, and access to I-80 is four blocks away.

The Eldorado Hotel has excellent facilities for lodging, meals, and meeting spaces, but since it is not a college campus with traditional shops and computer labs, it is recommended that you bring a laptop, especially Monday, when the entire afternoon session will be all about Adobe products entitled "An Afternoon With Adobe". The theme of the conference is "A Sure Bet—Working Together to Improve Graphic Arts Education," and we are inviting presenters to bring ideas that you can take back to use in your classrooms.

The conference costs will be finalized at the mid-winter Board meeting, but we anticipate that the price of the complete participant package (room, meals, presentations, reception, social, and banquet) will be near \$600. The guests' package will cost significantly less, tentatively near \$300. You will also have the option to bring additional family or friends to stay in the same room (max. of 4/room) for less than \$100 each for the term of the conference. This family/friend option will not include a meal plan or conference activities, but rest assured, there will be places for them to go and things for them to do!

The Eldorado Hotel has offered the option to extend your stay at reduced room rates if you would like to spend additional time in Reno. We recommend choosing to stay on after the conference, as prices will be lower on weekdays as opposed to weekends.

We are currently soliciting presenters for the conference and we will be adding information about them on our web site as we build the schedule. Visit the igaea.org website and click on the 2011 Annual Conference link in the blue column on the right side. It will take you to all of the 2011 Annual Conference web pages, which are currently being built. Understand that everything you see there now is tentative information and subject to change, but very close to the final info. There are active links throughout the site, and on the FAQ page there are links to the Eldorado Hotel and Conference Center and the Reno/Tahoe Tourism site, with more links being added as we complete the site. On March 1, 2011, we will have finalized the pages and begin the registration process. Check out the igaea.org site for more information now, and get ready to register March 1!
